Dear Friends,

The four weeks of Advent call us to a season of waiting and watching in anticipation of what God promises to do among us. It is a season of endings and new beginnings, of acknowledging that the God who has been faithful to us in the past will birth among us hope for tomorrow. In Advent, we cling to the promise of which the Apostle Paul writes in his letter to the church in Philippi: "I am certain that God, who began the good work within you, will be faithful to complete it until the day of Jesus Christ." (1:6)

This particular season of Advent is, for our congregation, an especially poignant time of waiting on God as we say farewell to two of our cherished staff members and prepare to fill their vacant positions. Last month we bid farewell to our full-time Youth Director, Rebecca Hensley, who led our youth program for more than two years and who now seeks new and broader career opportunities. Rebecca successfully modeled for our kids what it means to walk with Christ, to practice unconditional love for all people, and to face every challenge in life with grace and trust in God. She leaves behind a dedicated group of young leaders in our church who are eager to see the program continue to thrive in the years ahead. To that end, we have already begun the search for a qualified candidate to carry on her good work.

At the end of this month, we will also bid farewell to Joyce Calvin, our ever-faithful Administrative Assistant, who looks forward to the freedom of retirement beginning in January. Every so often you meet someone who has the unique ability to herd cats, and to do so with gentleness, patience, and kindness. Joyce is that unique person who, over the years, has successfully served the diverse needs of the laity while managing the growing administrative needs of the office and our staff. For all of us, she is not simply our Administrative Assistant, but our trusted friend, which is why, even as she enters retirement, we'll likely ask her to keep her key as she seeks new opportunities to serve our congregation in a volunteer capacity. We will celebrate Joyce's retirement in January and I trust that you will want to personally thank her for faithful service. As with the vacant Youth Director position, the Staff Parish Relations Committee has established a search committee to fill this pending vacancy.

This Advent is a season of endings and new beginnings for all of us. As we move through these transitions together, take some time to give thanks for the good work that God has done among us with these and all of our staff. And then join me in waiting and watching for what God promises to do with us in the months and years ahead.

Proclaim Jubilee

Forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors.

The African nation of Liberia has slashed its foreign debt by USD \$3 billion.

In default since the mid-1980's when Liberia was beginning to descend into civil war, most of the debt was sold and resold to hedge funds and other investors on the secondary market until by 2007, with penalties and high interest, it totaled 700 per cent of Liberia's national income.

Legal counselors from Cleary Gottlieb in New York City and financial advisors from Houlihan Lokey in London, both supported by the World Bank and the Government of Switzerland, alongside economic advisors from the Center for Global Development in Washington worked with Liberia for a fair solution.

Economic growth has accelerated to nine percent per year, school enrollments have grown rapidly, and health facilities have re-opened across the country.

Young Adult Group

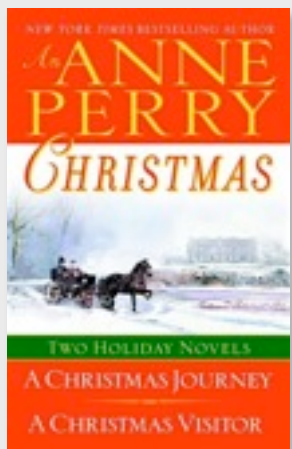
Monday Evenings at 6:30 pm

Just the other day, a friend said to me, "We have more than enough...Why not share it?" Why not, indeed.

Unfortunately, in these rough economic times there are some folks who do not have enough. They don't have a job, or a place to live, or enough food to feed their families. That's where we come in. We can help, with your help. Fortunately, here at San Dieguito UMC, we have an abundance to share with those who are down on their luck and temporarily or situationally homeless.

Each year, for the past 5 years, our church has served as a Host church as part of the county-wide Interfaith Shelter Network (ISN). From January 30th to February 13th, 2011, we will once again provide 12 homeless people (families and/or single adults) with meals, showers and a warm, safe place to sleep while they look for jobs, permanent housing, keep their kids in school, and generally attempt to improve their situations.

Those of us who have volunteered in the past, as hosts, meal preparers, or providers of groceries or cash, believe most profoundly that we have gained far more than we have given. Come! Volunteer with us! Put your faith in action once again.

Each year we get a little bit better at running a warm, inviting, user-friendly shelter with more realistic expectations, better routines, and better volunteers. We need your help to make this year's shelter even better. We hope you will join us and bring a friend or two to share the joy that comes with giving, whether it's your time, your talents, your resources, or all three. Your lives and your community will be blessed by the experience.

THANKS FOR SUPPORTING The Guatemala Mission Project!

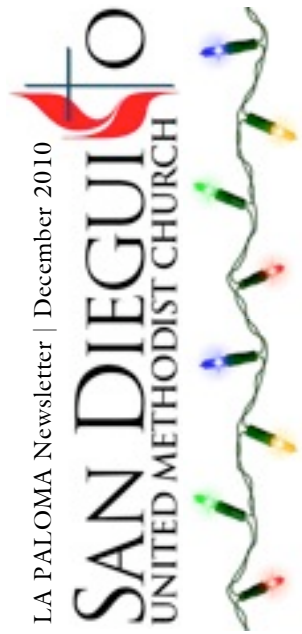
