October ushers in a change of seasons and the start of the Stewardship Campaign each year. Of course, there is an emphasis on raising funds to meet the needs of the church budget, which will go to support the programs and missions we are involved in, our facilities, our worship ministries, our pastors and staff, and apportionments. The amounts we commit to each of these are prayerfully considered

and approved to maintain the necessary balance in our spending.

This is also a time to reflect on the meaning of stewardship—why do we need to give to the church? What is my investment going to mean in the life of the church? This year, we have chosen 'Shine On!' as our theme to help us understand these questions, because the committee working on the campaign has a strong sense that there is more to the act of pledging our funds than simply meeting budgets. It is a chance to get to know each other better and develop our church family. When we join this church, we pledge to faithfully participate in the ministries of the church with our prayers, our presence, our gifts, and our service. This is what makes a church community, whether you are relatively new to the church or have been here many decades.

In Matthew 5 it says, 'You are the light of the world...let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven.' We will have an opportunity in several weeks to participate in the 'Light YOUR World' day of service, serving the people in our larger community in ways that we don't usually have access to. Our stewardship campaign is a way to continue that process, to 'Shine On!' in our walk with each other.

The Stewardship Committee is made up of people from all parts of the church and includes Cheryl Allen, Cal Ellisor, Rev. Mark Feldmeir, Gerry Filteau, Scott Fountain, Larry Herrmann, Donna Johnson, Rodney Lappe, Rick Kenney, Courtney Savage, and Carolyn Sechrist. We have already been working for several months in preparation for this year's activities. Each family in the church will be receiving an "Estimate of Giving" card at the beginning of next month so you can prayerfully consider your financial commitment for 2012. We will hear from individual speakers during Sunday services each week starting October 30th. Then, on November 13th, we will submit our cards as an act of faith in God and an expression of the promise we make to each other for the coming year.

We commit to support the church each year to renew our own sense of mission and purpose, for a deeper awareness of communion with God and with one another. As we begin that process, we want to celebrate the opportunity to participate in building our church family. Shine On!

## *Pensamientos*

Dear Friends,

A few months ago I was asked to officiate at a memorial service for a man I had never had the privilege of knowing. In preparing for the service, his wife shared with me several fascinating details about his life, including his brief service in the armed forces (he was wounded in the Normandy invasion), and his subsequent career as a dentist and distinguished professor at a major university. The man's father had also been a dentist in the Midwest during the days of the Great Depression when, for services rendered, he was often paid in chickens, eggs, goat's milk, and produce.

Raising a family on such limited resources, the father devised a method whereby each of his six children would be guaranteed a college education. According to the agreement, the parents would pay *only* for the first child's education. Upon graduation and obtaining stable employment, that first child, in turn, would be responsible for paying for the second child's education, and the second child, for the third, and on and on... The sixth and last child, upon his graduation, would be responsible for paying back his parents for the first child's education. This ingenious method proved to be a tremendous success. All six children, it turned out, fulfilled their obligation to their family and went on to live extraordinary lives.

That story reminds me of the obligation we share as a human family to make sacrifices for the sake of the next generation. What we receive in one season, we pass on in the next. This, I believe, is the very definition of stewardship: inheriting that which we did not earn, and bequeathing that which we cannot keep.

In the coming weeks, two important events will take place here at San Dieguito UMC which, by all appearances, would seem wholly unrelated to each other. On Sunday, November 6th, we will celebrate *All Saints' Day* in worship. We will remember those who have died over the last year and who, having finished the race, have joined “the great cloud of witnesses.” On the following Sunday, November 13th, we will celebrate the conclusion of our annual stewardship campaign—“Shine On!”—by dedicating our “estimate of giving cards” at the altar. As we experience these two Sundays together, we are reminded that we are here, in large part, because of those who paid our way by the stewardship of their lives; and that if the next generation is to thrive, it will be, in large part, because of what we have left them. On November 6th, we say “thank you.” On November 13th, we pay it forward.

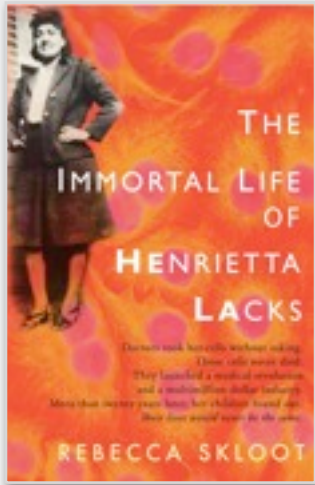

October 2nd is a feast day for the whole church. Every Christian church throughout the world has the chance on this one day to take communion together at the Lord's Table. And wonderful surprises can happen when people sit down and share a meal together.

One of my precious memories of communion took place about 20 years ago while my husband, Myron and I were attending a minister's conference. Our eight month old son, Jesse, was with us. Jesse was a wonderful baby, but he ate like an eight month old should eat which meant that lots of the time we never knew where his food might end up. Therefore, we sat down by ourselves at a round table at the fringes of the room. A friend of Myron's came up with four of his friends and asked if they could join us.

We warned them about Jesse's messy eating habits and said that, if they wanted to take the risk, we would love to share a meal with them. All five of the men were from Vietnam. Each had left Vietnam during the war in the early 70's, and after many difficult struggles, had gone to seminaries and were now pastors. As we ate together, we got better acquainted and discovered the reason why Myron's friend had wanted to eat with us. When he was forced to flee Vietnam, he and his young son had to leave behind his wife and another baby who was at the time, just the age of our baby. And in eating together around the table, he said that it helped him to remember her and gave him joy to be close to our baby.

Wonderful things can happen when people sit down around a table to have a meal together.

In our praying and sharing in the holy meal on World Communion Sunday, we join believers around the world who seek peace and transformation in Christ's message of forgiveness and love.

### Medical Emergency

Most of us desire to live in our own home; independent, and in control. Many of our elderly members are doing just that. They like it, and they are happy! But—they need to be SAFE. They need to have a way to call for help in an Emergency. There is a way to do just that:

The *Personal Emergency Response System* (PERS) has 3 parts:

- ▶ 1. **BUTTON** (transmitter)  
Lightweight, WATERPROOF!  
Battery-powered and easily activated by pressing the button.  
Worn around neck or wrist 24/7. Never taken off—like a wedding ring!
- ▶ 2. **CONSOLE**  
Connected via phone line. Works with any private telephone.  
Automatically dials one or more pre-selected emergency numbers.
- ▶ 3. **EMERGENCY RESPONSE CENTER**—2 Types  
Provider-based—county-wide. Manufacturer-based—national.

PERS can be purchased, rented or leased. It is usually not covered by Medicare or insurance. Fees range from \$200 to \$1500. There is usually an installation fee (may be waived). Monthly monitoring fees range from \$10 to \$40 per month.
