Summer is just around the corner, and if you are looking for summer activities for your child or youth, check out the programs available through our church. If you have preschool or elementary school children, during *Baobab Blast* Vacation Bible School, June 21st thru 25th, children will set off on an exciting adventure through the African Savannah and explore their faith through music, science, crafts, games and small-group Bible messages. Vacation Bible School typically has 70 to 80 children involved in the program, so this is a great way for your child to see friends from church as well as make new friends from our community. Sign-ups are still going on and registration forms are available in the office.

The United Methodist Church District Camps at camp Cedar Glen are camps designed for campers 1st Grade thru 2010 High School graduates.

There are four age-specific camps:

- ▶ Senior High (10th thru 2010 graduates)—July 11th/17th
- ▶ Junior High (7th thru 9th grade)—July 18th/24th
- ▶ Older Elementary (4th thru 6th grade)—July 25th/31st
- ▶ Younger Elementary (1st thru 3rd grade)—July 25th/28th

The camp programs this summer are centered on the theme of Dr. Seuss. During "Rethink Dr. Seuss" campers will RETHINK Church and its place in every area of life; Nature, Nurturing Community, Social Community, Economics, Politics and the World. The creative mind of Dr. Seuss as well as Horton, the Sneeches, the Lorax and many other characters will help to illuminate the love and beauty of Jesus Christ's message. Over the past few years the camp attendance from San Dieguito UMC has been steadily increasing and our youth have not only been campers but have also worked as counselors during the Elementary School camps. ## *Pensamientos...*

Dear Friends,

Our "From Strength to Strength" capital campaign is off to a great start, thanks in large part to the inspiring prayer vigil on April 17th (organized by Cindy Fountain) and Kick-off Sunday on April 18th, which included a delicious barbeque picnic lunch (organized by Dave Roach). On Kick-off Sunday, at the conclusion of our celebration together, I was encouraged and emboldened by a conversation with one of our families who, desiring to make a difference in this campaign, made the first pledge for \$100,000. With that generous pledge, our campaign is off and running.

During these days of the campaign, I am grateful for the opportunity to meet with so many of you in home gatherings—listening to your hopes and dreams for your church, fielding your questions, encouraging one another as we each consider our role in the campaign. What inspires me most about these conversations is your deep appreciation for those "saints" whose past sacrifices have made this church such a refuge for us and future generations.

As many of you know, prior to my appointment here I spent twelve rewarding years growing a new congregation, raising funds through three separate capital campaigns, and finally buying land and building a church. What I discovered at the end of that difficult and sacrificial journey was that the reward of building a church was even greater than I had ever imagined. Our goal was to put a roof over our heads and to establish a permanent place from which we could do ministry. Yet we were so focused on addressing the present needs of that community that we never really paused to think about the difference we were making in the lives of those who would follow us many years later. That church would not only be a home for us; it would also become a home for others for generations to come, because of us.

As I walk around this campus and see so many vibrant ministries flourishing here on a daily basis, I give quiet thanks for those of our past whose vision and sacrifices have brought us to this time and place. When I do that, I am reminded that every generation of believers is called by God to add another line to the great drama that is God's story in a given place. Here, in this place, part of that great story has already been written by those who have arrived before us. But the story of this church is not yet finished, nor will it ever be. Today, we do our part by adding another line, knowing that others will inherit the story from us, before passing it on again and again.

The great story goes on and on, and each of us has a line to contribute. What will our contribution be?

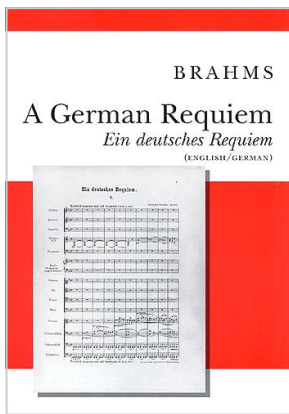

## REQUIEM

BY Johannes Brahms  
SUNG IN ENGLISH

Chancel Choir & Orchestra Concert  
Sunday Evening, **May 16th** at 7:00 o'clock

Why on earth hear a *Requiem*???

If you are not familiar with this music or even its title, you might very well ask this question. To start, a requiem is a memorial service in music. However, this is *not* a Roman Catholic service, but a protestant service and intended to be performed as a concert rather than a ceremony. In the 1860's, Brahms used a biblical

Concordance to help him select the texts himself. He confided to a friend that he never went a day without his Bible. AND, he intended it to honor his mother and his great friend Robert Schumann who had passed on.

For instance, "How lovely is Thy dwelling place" is a great and well-known chorus which is the centerpiece of the Requiem. (As they have done many times in the past, the Choir will sing this as an anthem in the morning services of May 16th.) Its text, in similar fashion of the other movements, comes from Psalm 84, and concludes with "Blessed are they that live on in your house. They praise God's name forever." This piece does *not* intend to impact our outer layer, but reaches inside of us—to our core—and *stays* there.

What a gift God gave to Johannes Brahms! And what a gift He gave to all of us to experience the musical message of his "Requiem" for centuries!

## Steve Hayes at Home

*An Interview—April 7, 2010*

Many of you know Steve Hayes, 75, who suffered a massive heart attack on February 11th. He had no history of heart problems and had spent the previous year battling and overcoming colon cancer with surgery, radiation and chemotherapy. Indeed, he had just received the "all clear" from his doctor three weeks prior.

Now, just home three days with his wife, Sandy, and daughter, Shannon, Steve agreed to an interview. I arrived to find him in good spirits, lounging on his couch, with his trademark Steve Hayes smile.

He looked great, and his first words were, "...I've returned from the dead!"

Raised in Brooklyn, NY, Steve has lived in California since he was discharged from the Navy in 1957. He worked as a stable agent for 25 years, assisting a TV producer with his racehorses. He joined SDUMC four years ago, when he and his wife moved to Encinitas from San Diego.

When asked how he felt about his recent experience, he answered, "It's surreal.

I'm happy to be home, but sometimes I'm apprehensive. I'm anxious about breathing. I wake up during the night gasping, afraid I won't be able to get my breath. I'm afraid the stents on my heart will fail. My doctor says this is very common; that gradually I will become more confident, and less anxious."

Those things he missed most while in the hospital were his wife, Sandy, and his kids. The first thing he wanted to do when he got home was to lie down on his own couch in his living room. He was relieved to be home, but still apprehensive about suddenly being on his own after having had so much watchful care of hospital staff.



In comparing his recent heart trouble to his cancer experience, Steve said this was far more traumatic. "There were times when I thought I would die, but then when I closed my eyes, looking for death, it didn't come. So I thought that must mean I am going to live. Then I really got determined to get home."

What advice would he give someone going through a similar experience?

- 1) Be patient.
- 2) Have faith.
- 3) Do what the doctor says.

Steve attributes his recovery to "the prayers and support from my community, my church, my friends all over the U.S. and my desire to write two or three more books."

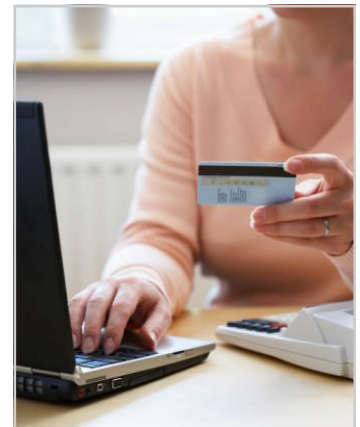
